Sir,-The Bell Telephone Company have applieds for permissito build their line through the Serpent River Indian Reserve.



The Company do not require any width for the Right of We Way but to erect the poles and operate and maintain telegraph and telephone wires thereon with the right of free ingress and egress along and ever the reserve for the purpose of constructing and maintaining the line with the right to trim any trees so as to keep the wires cleared at least eighteen inches.

I shall feel obliged if you will see upon what condime tions the Indians will surrender these rights across the reserve A blue print showing the proposed line and width of clearing is forwarded under separate cover.
