Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that His Excellency the Governor General in Council has been pleased to accept of the Surrender made by the Indians of Passpasschase's Band of the land comprised in their Reserve, and I have now to request that you will be good enough to inform me:--

1st. What price, in your opinion, should be asked by the Department for these lands.

2nd. Whether the demand for them is so great as to warrant the Department in authorizing an auction sale to be held, and if so what would be the best time and place for holding such sale.

3rd. Are there any squatters upon the tract, and if so how long have they been in occupation of and what improvements have they made on the land. Please also state their names.
