Q. 17. Kindly tell the Court what you know of that greatcoat.

Q. 18. Anything else you can add?

A. 18. No.

Cross-examination by Defending Officer:

Q. 19. Do you remember approximately what date that was?

A. 19. No.

Q. 20. Had Jillings been keeping his greatcoat in the same hut where you were?

A. 20. Yes.

No re-examination.

In the opinion of the Court and the Judge Advocate it is not necessary to comply with R.P. 83 (B).

The witness withdraws:

3d Witness B-11201, Pte. J.H. Gossey, Perth Regt (M), sworn, examined by Prosecutor:

Q. 21. You are a member of the Perth Regt?

A. 21. Yes.

Q. 22. What company?

A. 22. "A"

Q. 23. Are you acquainted with Pte. Miller of the same company?

A. 23. Yes.

Q. 24. Are you aware of the fact that he lost a greatcoat?

A. 24. Yes.

Q. 25. Whereabouts were you quartered or living at the time?

A. 25. In the same hut.

Q. 26. What part of the country was that?

A. 26. Chilton Foliat.

Q. 27. Have you any recollection now what the time was? Middle of November, on leave, stayed in the hut because didn't have much money. In the morning Pte. Jillings came in, said he was going to use the greatcoat for the day.

A. 27.

Q. 28. Do you recognize the accused in Court?

A. 28. Yes. In the morning he took the coat and said he was going to use it for the day.

Q. 29. You mentioned November, that is November of 1941?

A. 29. Yes.
