III., second of the name, add.), b. 1843, at Harrow, Eng.;
son of Bishop Christopher Wordsworth, *supra*; grad-

uated at New College, Oxford, 1865; Fellow of Brasenose
College 1867-74 and 1882-85; tutor 1867-83; was ap-
pointed prebendary of Lincoln 1870-83; Oriel professor
of the interpretation of Holy Scripture at Oxford and
canon of Rochester Cathedral 1883-85; since then
Bishop of Salisbury. He has contributed to the Dic-

Worms, Baron Henry De, (of Austria), F.R.A.S.,
b. 1840, in London; educated at Paris, and at King's
College, London; called to the bar at the Inner Temple
1863; M.P. for Greenwich 1880-83, and since then for
East Toxteth, Liverpool; parliamentary secretary to the
Board of Trade 1885-86, and 1886-88, and since then
under-secretary of state for the colonies. 1. England's
