A country post office on Canard river, in West Sandwich township, Essex County, 8 miles south of Sandwich, the county seat, and 10 south of Windsor, the nearest shipping and banking point. It contains a Catholic church and common school, and ships cordwood, ties and logs. It is on the stage route from Sandwich to Amherstburg, fare 35c to either place. Population, 100. Mail tri-weekly. Nearest bank at Dunnville. Settled in 1810. It has Methodist and Baptist churches and a public school, and ships lumber and timber. Stage daily to Canfield and Darling Road. Population, 400.
