Scaled Tenders, addressed to the undersigned and endorsed "Tender for work at Ste. Anne," will be received at this office until the arrival of the Eastern and Western mails, on Tuesday, the 19th day of September, inst., through rock in the bed of the river on the up-stream side of the new canal works at Ste. Anne.

A plan, showing the position and section of the proposed channel and specifications of the work to be done, can be seen at this office, and at the office of the resident Engineer, at Ste. Anne, on and after Friday, the 8th inst., where printed forms of Tender can be obtained.
