Major Barclay, reported, from the Committee appointed Yesterday, to prepare an Address to his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, on the subject of the Importation of certain Articles from the United States of America, and presented a Draft of an Address to his Excellency, which was twice read and is as follows:

To His Excellency

JOHN PARR, Efq.

Lieutenant-Governor and Commander in Chief in and over his Majesty's Province of Nova-Scotia, and its Dependencies, Vice Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

The humble ADDRESS of the Representatives of the Province of Nova-Scotia in GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

May it please your Excellency,

THE House of Assembly having seriously considered the present Situation of the Province of Nova-Scotia, and being perfect-" ly convinced, that the Resources of the Province, are now fully " adequate to the fupply of its Inhabitants, in many of the Articles " hitherto permitted by your Excellency to be imported from the "United States of America, earnestly request your Excellency will be " pleased, from and after the Eighteenth Day of November next, to " permit the Importation only of Scantling, Planks, Staves, Heading "Boards, Shingles, Hoops, Bread, Biscuit, Flour, Pease, Wheat, "Rye, Rice and Indian Corn, and prohibit the Importation of all " other Goods and Commodities whatever, which your Excellency " may be authorifed to permit, in, and by an Ast of Parliament paffed " in the Twenty eight Year of His Majesty's Reign, intitled, "An Act " for regulating the Trade between His Majesty's Colonies and Plan-" tations in North-America, and in the West-India Islands, and the " Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His " Majesty's said Subjects, and the Foreign Islands in the West Indies." Ordered, That the Address be engrossed.

A Petition of William Lawlor presented.

A Petition of William Lawlor, was presented by Mr. Morris, and read, setting forth, that the Petitioner has at a very heavy Expence, erected a Mill and Presses for making linseed Oil, and praying he may be allowed a Bounty on the Oil fo manufactured by him.

Ordered, That the Petition do lie on the Table.

Major Barclay pursuant to leave, presented a Bill to impower His Majesty's Justices of the Supreme Court, to require and take Bail from Persons removing, or bringing up Causes from Inferior Courts to the Supreme Court, and the same was read a first time.

Ordered, That the Bill do lie on the Table, to be read a fecond time.
