And then the Messenger withdrew.

The faid Bill was read a first time.

Resolved, That the Bill be read a second-time.

A petition of Enos Collins, and Andrew Wright, of Halifax, Merchants, was presented by Mr. Lawson, and read, praying a further suspension for six months of the payment of the Duties on a quantity of Sugar, by them imported from the Brazils, in June, 1811, for exportation to the United States of America.

A petition of Matthew Richardson, was presented by Mr. Lawson, and read, praying for a Drawback of the Excise duty by him paid on certain articles of Merchandize exported to the Port of Buston in the Months of April, May and June last, amounting to £ 31-12.

A petition of Hugh Denoon, Robert Pagan and James Milnes, Magistrates at Pictou, was presented by Mr. Mortimer, and read, praying payment of Expences incurred by them, for the securing and conveying to the Goal at Halisax, one Matthew Reynolds, who was appreheaded on suspicion of being an Alien, amounting to £32 12.

A petition of the Reverend Alexander M'Donald, Hugh Denoon and others, Magittrates and Inhabitants of the District of Pictou and its Vicinity, was presented by Mr. Mortimer, and read, praying for a further aid, towards completing the Pier at Arisag Point on the Gul f of St. Lawrence.

Ordere!, That the faid Petitions do lie on the Table.

Mr. Binney, Collector of Impost and Excise for the District of Halisax, pursuant to the order of the House, presented to the House, an account of all the Securities for duries due the Province, specifying the date and amount of each Security, and by whom payable, with the payments made thereon, and the dates of such payments.

Ordered, That the account do lie on the Table to be perused by the Members of the House.

Mr. Lawson reported from the committee appointed to join a committee of his Majesty's Council to examine the public accounts, and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered it in at the Clerk's Table, where it was read, and is as follows:
