A Petition of the Hon. Thomas Heath Haviland, President, and other Office-bearers of the Charlottetown Horticultural Society, praying that this House will concur with the House of Assembly, in granting a sum of money in aid of the Funds of that Institution.

Ordered, That the said Petition be referred to the Special Committee appointed to examine and report on all Petitions relating to Miscellaneous subjects.

A Petition of divers Inhabitants of Townships Numbers Sixty-one, Sixty-three, and Sixty-four—praying, that as the Education Act is about to expire, the Holy Scriptures may be placed on the List of Books now in use in the public Schools, and that they be introduced into the Academy and Normal School, to be daily read by the children of those parents, who do not object to their use, and taught therein by such Teachers as the Parents may approve of.
