Enfistment will be for one year, or during the continuance of the war. The men must be between 20 and 35 years of age, and of physique equal to the ordinary cavalry soldier. equal to the ordinary cavalry soldier. Officers are to provide their own horses and to wear neutral tint closeshooting jackets, not necessarily uniform, felt hats, breeches and gaiters.

All must be good riders and marksmen. The same order invites every

The same order invites every volunteer regiment that is link d with a regular battalion serving at the front to supply a full company, which will take the place of the mounted infantry of the regiment.
