
In an interview with Field Super-intendent B. F. Dowd, of the Iro-quois Pipe Line Company and Vol-canic Oil and Gas Company, The Planet was informed yesterday that the new purifiers will be here in a week or ten days, and Mr. Dowd says that thereafter all gas will be purified. The purifiers will all be installed within the next three weeks.

The Volcanic Company are now laying pipe to connect up the Gra-ham. Richardson and Grant wells. nam, Richardson and Grant water, which will give an added supply of 6,000,000 cubic feet per day. This quantity added to the present output makes 120,000,000 cubic feet per day, and assures the company of a supply which will most all requirements. which will meet all requirements from a small jet to a 250 horse power beiler. They have also this week placed an order for ten miles of six-inch piping to replace the of six-inch piping to replace the three-inch pipe now connecting the city with the Halliday well. Super-intendent Dowd understands that the Chatham Gas Company have ordered two miles of three-inch pipe, which will be used to connect the city mains with the new purifying station at the rear of the C. P. R. station, for a high pressure service. A quantity of four and eight-inch pipe has also been ordered by the Chatham Gas Company, which will be used to replace that now used for the low pressure system.

The gas companies will now be in a position to supply all demands made upon them.
