San Francisco, May 14.—The liquor question was again discussed Saturday by the authorities, and it was proposed that the charter of the city be amended so that a saloon license, which has here to that a salroon needs, which has here-tofore been \$100 a year shall be raised to \$500. 

The new international code of day signals for merchant vessels went into effect in 1901 and consists of nineand five pennants, besides the code or answering pennant. With the excep-tion of the last named signal, all are assigned to different letters of the al-phabet. In this way by the use of dif-ferent flags all kinds of messages may



be spelled out, but some of the alphabetic flags have special meanings when hoisted alone. Thus, "Yes," in the international code is represented by C, a white pennant containing near the staff a red disk. "No" is represented by D, a blue pennant with a white disk. A vessel in distress may hoist the flags standing for N and C. The first is a square flag containing blue and white squares arranged like a and white squares arranged like a checkerboard. The second has already been described Two burgees, or swallowtail flags, the first white and blue, the second red, stand for A and B. The form of these signals, though not their color, is given in the engrav-ings at the head of the column. The flag A may be used over that of B to signal "Abandon the vessel as fast as

Several thousand signals may be given by different combinations of flags. The signals in common use, however, are comparatively few.


