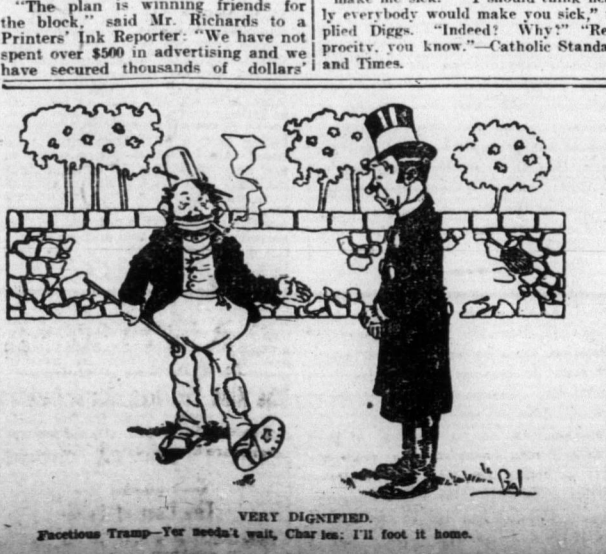

RUSSIA AND PERSIA. St. Petersburg, May 29.—The sensational reports published in certain London newspapers regarding the possibility of a rupture of diplomatic relations between Russia and Persia are discredited at the Foreign Office and the Persian Legation here.

TO FLY IN EUROPE. Paris, May 29.—Wilbur Wright, the aeronaut, one of the Wright brothers, of Dayton, Ohio, arrived in this city to-day from America. The European representative of the Wrights, Hart O. Berg, of Philadelphia, says the purpose of Mr. Wright's visit here is to demonstrate in Europe the capabilities of their machine. The preliminary arrangements for the demonstrations are complete, a suitable enclosed field, two miles square, having been secured in western France.

Several Arrests Made in Connection With His Death. New York, May 29.—An investigation was begun to-day into the circumstances surrounding the mysterious death of Charles H. Holmes, a wealthy Boston leather merchant, last night. Mr. Holmes died in the lobby of the Hoffman House, where he had been a guest, immediately after his return there in a taxicab from a visit to the house in West 47th Street. He had been taken suddenly ill during his visit, and was hurried back to the hotel before a physician was summoned. After his death the police took him into the custody of the employees of the hotel. The cabman, who had been detained by the detectives, was taken into custody, and accompanied the detectives to the 47th Street house, where Mrs. Moore and the maid and elevator man were found. Mr. Holmes' body was given into the custody of a Coroner. He had made the hotel his headquarters on monthly business trips to New York for many years. He was 65 years old.
