

From Toronto Saturday Night: The inimum rate of discount by Canadian anks is 51% per cent., and only a small proportion of our manufacturers and hanks is 514 per cent., and only a small proportion of our manufacturers and business men get accommodation at this rate—they usually pay 6 to 644 per cent, which is only fractionally less than during the panicky period of eighteen months ago. And yet there is a great plethora of money at present, so bank-ers say, as against practically none dur-ing the depression a year and a balf ago. 
