CONNEBIAL PELICITY. A DIVORCE CASE IN THE ENGLISH COURTS.

The case of Sast versus Sant came before the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, in England, a few days ago. It was in form of an appeal from the Appellate Court of Malta in a divorce suit brought by the Countees Generous against her husband, Count Gio, Francesco Sant, Barno.
