Wilson Orders



Admiral Benson's message gave no reason for the president's order and the White House professed to have no information on the subject but interpreting in the light of press des patches from Paris telling of the president's determination that delays at the peace conference must end. most officials regarded it as significant. Added importance was also given by the fact that this was the second message from the admiral regarding the ship's departure, the first, received resterday having inquired as to the time the vessel could get under way.
