FRAMING.—On Christmas Day a successful teaming was held in the Methodist Church here. Tea was served in the old house adjoining, and the spread reflected great credit on the ladies of the district. The church was built last spring at a cost of nearly \$700. The greater part of this sum has already been paid, and the object of the meeting was to assist in paying off the remaining debt. Mr. Ecklen occupied the chair, and after a witty address, called upon Rev. R. Davey, who spoke in a very practical way on the relations of the people to the pastor. Rev. Mr. Cooke followed in an exceedingly humorous introduction, and closed in an eloquent description of the church's position in the world. Mr. T. McMillan, then addressed the meeting, in a plea for good-will and love amongst all believers, and trust in God as a source of peace. The result of the social was some \$36.50; and this was supplemented by \$10.50 in offerings at the close. The Nile choir sang some sweet anthems during the evening. Mr. Davey has evidently a warm place in the hearts of his people at Sheppardton, and the pretty little church will be a monument of his energy and devotedness in advancing the cause of God in this section. Colborne.

CORRECTION.—In the Treasurer's statement, Dec., 1880, of the township of Colborne, published last week, an item \$462, to the City Treasurer, London, was inadvertently omitted. Hence the disparity between the amount on the list and the grand total to that amount. **COUNCIL MEETING.**—The Municipal Council of Colborne met in the Township Hall, on Wednesday, 18th December. Members all present, Reeve in the chair. Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed. John McQuarrie was refunded \$1.17 taxes, his assessment ticket showing \$200 and assessment roll \$300. Mr. J. Robertson was refunded \$3.58 taxes, being assessed in wrong S. Section. Mr. Fisher was similarly assessed and was refunded \$4.56. Geo. Campbell received the sum \$30 for rent on his house occupied by Mrs. C. Sin, chair and family—Carried. Moved and seconded, that R. T. Haynes receive the sum of \$55, payment in full for contract on Lake Shore Road—Carried. Moved and seconded, that the Reeve, Deputy Reeve and Councillors receive each the sum of \$25, payment for services for the past year—Carried. Moved and seconded, that the nominations, be held in the Township Hall on the last Monday in December at the hour of 12 o'clock noon, and in case a poll be demanded that the election be held in the different subdivisions as follows, viz: Sub-division No. 1, Head's shore, Bonmiller, W. Robertson, D. R. officer; Sub-div. No. 2, Temperance Hall, Maitlandville, A. Sands, D. R. officer; No. 3, Township Hall, J. A. McDonagh, R. officer; No. 4, Temperance Hall, Leburn, Jas. O. Stewart, D. R. officer. A large number of accounts were presented and ordered to be paid. The Council then adjourned.

Port Albert.

The nomination in the township of Ashfield for Reeve, Deputy Reeve and Councillors came off to-day in Findlay's School House, in an orderly and business-like manner. The township clerk, Mr. John Cooke, acting as Returning officer. Mr. Webster, the old Reeve, being nominated; also, James Harlow, who afterwards elected to run for Councillor for which office he was also nominated. Mr. Webster was then declared elected by acclamation. Mr. Joseph Griffin was elected Deputy Reeve, there being no one with sufficient courage to meet our big Jo. For Councillors the following gentlemen were nominated: Messrs. Whitely, Clare, and McMurichie, the old Councillors, and James Harlow, and Thomas Findley, new aspirants for municipal honors. Mr. Harlow gave the meeting a brief specimen of his speaking qualities for which he is justly celebrated.

Great indignation was manifested at the action of the County Council, in equalizing Ashfield two dollars per acre higher than usual at its last June session; and it was proposed to instruct the Township representatives to resort to the means provided in the Statutes for such matters, in case the County Council should not do the township justice at its next June meeting. It is to be hoped some simple scheme may be devised for arriving at the true valuation of the property in each municipality, so as to avoid these annual wire pulling, log rolling, scheming transaction that take place in all our County Councils.

If we could get up a small syndicate to build a harbor here, I think the people would support it in preference to the larger one, that is at present about to become an important government in the North-west. But the people of Ontario who pay the largest share of Federal taxation, may go on taxing themselves for local improvements, or go without improvement, while our legislators are discussing brilliant schemes for making everything comfortable for Europeans, Icelanders, Monmouthites and foreign capitalists in our North-west territory. For want of a small harbor here we are suffering very much. We got the magnificent grant of \$1,500 last session. Now, I think if we could get nine or ten thousand dollars judiciously expended here, we could ship our tan bark, cordwood, lumber, etc., on equal terms with other places.—*ALBORA.*
