



Aviator Shot in Chest

And Wings of Biplane pierced by Bul-Its, but makes his way to Bulgarian Camp and falls dead.

Constantin, a French aviator in the Bulgarian service, who was decorated by King Ferdinand for bravery, is described in a despatch just received here. Dr. Constantin started from Surma Village on his last flight over the Tchatalja lines, with the object of dropping bombs on the Turkish His biplane disappeared rapidly, and some hours after was seen to descend near the Bulgarian camp. The aviator was found lying on the ground dead, with a wound in his chest. The wings of the biplane had also been pierced by bullets.

The instruments showed that he had reached a height of nearly 4,000 feet. He had photographed the Turkist lines and evidently had been shot, but had strength to guide the machin back before he expired.
