War News.

Messages Received During the Night.

FRENCH CONFIDENT. Special to Evening Telegram. PARIS, Aug. 27. No official communication concerning the progress of the war has been issued this morning.

BRITISH SOLDIERS STAND. LONDON, Aug. 27. British soldiers in the battle in Belgium were unbeaten, when the general situation necessitated General Joffre's order of retirement all along the line.

GERMAN CRUISER LOST. BERLIN, via Amsterdam and London, Aug. 27. The German Admiralty have issued the following: "The light cruiser Magdeburg ran ashore in a fog on the island of Odensburg, in the Gulf of Finland. Owing to thick weather, the other German warships were not able to render assistance, and all efforts to float the vessel having failed, the captain decided to sacrifice his ship as a superior Russian naval force was preparing to attack. Under heavy fire from the Russian fleet the majority of the cruiser's crew were saved by the German torpedo boats. Seventeen men were killed and 25 wounded; 85, including the captain, are missing. The Magdeburg was blown up. The survivors reached Germany to-day."

RUSSIAN VICTORIES. PARIS, Aug. 27. An official statement by the War Office, this afternoon, says: "The German troops have retired to the region of Mazan. The Russian Government announces victory after victory. The Russian advance is unretarded in that country, which presents difficulties, and the outlet of which was occupied yesterday. It is confirmed that 100 cannon were taken from the enemy."

GERMAN PALATIAL LINER SUNK BY BRITISH CRUISER. LONDON, Aug. 27. The Kaiser Wilhelm Der Grosse has been sunk off the West Coast of Africa by the British cruiser High Flyer. She was one of the palatial steamers of the North German Lloyd line. At the outbreak of the war she was converted into an armed cruiser, and since has been actively searching for British merchantmen.

PARIS PREPARING FOR EVENTS. PARIS, Aug. 27. The Ministry of War has decided to make Paris a perfectly entrenched camp as a precautionary measure.

SHARP FIGHTING AT LILLE. PARIS, Aug. 27. Sharp fighting occurred at the gates of Lille between German cavalry and French troops, but it is reported here that the Germans were beaten towards Seclin, losing a number of prisoners. This detachment of Germans approached Lille from Monsieur advancing until between Roubaix and Tourcoing.

AUSTRIANS RETREATING. PARIS, Aug. 27. The Serbian Legation here has announced that the Austrians have evacuated the San Jan Novibazin and the village of Kosovo, situated between Montenegro and Servia.

TILSIT OCCUPIED. ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 27. The following official communication was made public to-day: "Our offensive, both in East Prussia and Galicia has developed increasing success. On August 25th, the Germans hastily retreated everywhere towards Koenigsburg and Allenstein. The Russians have occupied Tilsit, a town 60 miles north east of Koenigsburg in East Prussia. In Galicia our troops are marching rapidly on Limberg. They are approaching the city quickly. Our cavalry has pursued the enemy everywhere on our line of advance. Frequent attacks are being made on the Austrians who each time have been beaten and routed."

BRITISH MARINES PROTECT OSTEND. British marines have occupied Ostend to prevent the Germans from getting a foothold on the English Channel.

German Naval Losses.

The Kaiser Wilhelm which was sunk by H.M.S. High Flyer, is a liner of 14,349 tons, which has been armed and converted into an auxiliary cruiser. The High Flyer is a light cruiser which has been used as a training ship for cadets. She was built in 1898. Her tonnage is 5,600 and her horsepower 15,000. She carries eleven six inch guns. The German cruiser Magdeburg, which was lost in the Gulf of Finland, is a sister ship of the Breslau, which escaped into the Dardanelles. She was built in 1911. Her tonnage is 4,500 and she carries twelve 4.1 guns.
