

Palmerston.
OFF THE TRACK—The engine of the last excursion train from Southampton on Friday night last, was thrown off the track about a mile north of Palmerston, by a small tree which had been burnt down and fallen across the track. She was quickly stopped, and got on again without any damage being done.

Narrow Escapes—A pulley, connected with the turning lath in Westgate's pump factory burst on Saturday, owing to the too sudden start of the horse which drives the lath. One of the Bell, but fortunately did not hurt him.

Apples are falling from the trees, and the prospects are that apples for fall use will be cheap, while winter apples will be dear. In some cases apples and grapes and other fruit are literally scorched and baked, on the side exposed to the sun. A good rain would be very welcome. A farmer in the vicinity is taking advantage of the dryness to burn a field of stumps, and the scattered lights at night is a sight we seldom see in this part of the country. The old days of logging and burning are gone by. We notice in the bars, barrels of water in the field to quench the fire wherever it spreads, a precaution that it would be well to take in all such cases.
