White & McConnell, St. Thomas, killed a large tarantula in their store Thursday. It measured three inches across.

A new court of the L. O. F. has been installed at Watford, and another will shortly be organized in Warwick village.

The Reeve and Treasurer of West Nisour were authorized to borrow the sum of \$1,200 to meet current expenditures for this year.

Sam Barnes is erecting a building near the railroad, at Old Springs, for a cup factory and a chopping mill, a thing much needed.

Three or four months ago a 10-year-old son of Marshall Bodine, of Fingal, ran away from home. The lad was found in Detroit.

Thos. Presay, of Vienna, received a kick in the face last week from a colt, which split his nose open. He will be disgraced somewhat.

The Aliborough Council gave a grant of \$25 towards clearing and opening out the division line between the 4th and 7th concessions lines.

A lime, brick and tile yard has been started in Old Springs by the brickmaker at Aliborough, and the first kiln of brick and tile has been burnt.

The bylaw granting \$500 to the Sydenham Valley Canning Company was carried at Watford on the other day by a vote of 137 for to 37 against.

No. 6, the new commercial wharf strung by the M. C. R. runs from Suspension Bridge to Detroit, a distance of 223 miles, and was strung in sixteen days.

D. W. McIntyre has just completed a fine new granary at North Glenora on the C. P. R., comprising about 100,000 bushels and is the grain trade there this season.

George Burr, Putnam, leaves in a few days for Portage la Prairie, Man., where he has been engaged to teach in the Commercial College for one year. Salary \$450.

The Presbyterian Church at Springfield, which has been undergoing considerable repairs and improvements, will be reopened for divine service on Sunday, Aug. 24.

The work of locating poles and preparing to string the electric wires in Ingersoll is being vigorously pushed ahead, and the system will be in operation in a short time.

The Walkerville Council has decided to co-operate with Windsor, and build a sewer to empty into the Detroit River below rather than above the latter town's waterworks.

A petition has been circulated and signed in St. Thomas for presentation to the City Council asking for repeal of the bylaw limiting the number of hotels to eighteen and shops to four.

Ed. Harrison, of Stratford, has invented a combination counter scale and writing desk, which is a handsome piece of work, besides showing ingenuity in its style of arrangement.

In Ingersoll on Friday evening last Mr. Robert Stuart, groom, presented with a gold-headed cane and Mrs. Stuart received a silver fruit dish from their friends in St. Paul's Church.

Bradford has decided to purchase a fire alarm system, costing \$4,000, and has awarded the contract for the erection of the same to the Gaynor Electric Company, of Louisville, Ky.

Messrs. Nelson, Bees, Ingersoll, have in their possession a hand reaper over 100 years old. It was originally used in Prince Edward county and is supposed to have been made in Ireland. It is a curiosity.

Miss Milligan, of Erie, has been chosen as assistant teacher in the Milverton public school. She has had twelve years' experience in teaching, and has just returned from the Normal School, bringing excellent recommendations.

A very sad and fatal accident occurred at Philipburg on Saturday, in which a young man by the name of Becker lost his life. He was working in the brickyard digging, when the clay fell in, killing him instantly.

Five horses belonging to John Richards, Watford, strayed into a barn where only loose boards were used as flooring and fell through, and were found hanging in all shapes. They were speedily rescued from their critical position.

One of the neatest of the Beachville bridge was broken a few days ago, the result of the extra strain caused by the passage over it of William's traction engine. It has been temporarily braced and rendered comparatively safe, but requires new timber.

About five years ago a young man of unusual mind, son of Mr. Alex. Linton, of Hibbert, wandered away from his home, and no trace of his whereabouts could be found until a few days ago, when he received word that the young fellow is in a Minnesota hospital.

Professor Saunders, of the Experimental Farm, has returned from a trip to the East. He reports that the crops in the eastern townships are very fair, and quite an average crop. In the Queen's Valley, in New Brunswick, and other more fertile parts of the Province the crops looked very well.

The Dundas Banner says: "Dr. Walker has disposed of the Dundas and Waterloo road, the arrangement being that the road is to revert to the Government on repayment of the money he paid on it. The price which he was to pay was \$21,500. This was six years ago. He paid the deposit and met one payment of \$9,000, making \$12,500. This sum is to be returned to him with interest at 6 per cent. The impression is that before long the road will be in the hands of the Ontario Government, to whom it has all along been contendedly properly belongs."

On Sunday evening the 10th inst., a heavy storm passed over the district, lightning striking the barn of Mr. D. Coward, of the 9th con., burning it to the ground together with its contents, consisting of his fall wheat and barley, also two wagons with their loads which had been drawn in late on Saturday night. Mr. Coward's loss will be heavy, as there was no insurance on the contents; the buildings were insured.

A number of changes were made in the circuit at the quarterly official business meeting held at Dorchester Station lately. Nisour circuit being lately abandoned by the last Conference, Nisour Church is attached to this circuit and the preaching services at the appointment known as the Hamilton Road Church is discontinued; numerically and financially it takes a front rank. The salary of the superintendent minister was raised \$50 and that of the junior minister \$30.

The Eglar Royal Templars, of which a district meeting was held in St. Thomas, lately, seems to be in a flourishing condition the membership being: St. Thomas, 84; Aylmer, 55; Richmond 30, and Sparta over 100, making a total membership of about 330. It was decided to hold the next district meeting in Sparta some time in January, the date to be fixed by the Sparta Council and the Executive of the District Council.

Thursday was Windsor's civic holiday and all of the business places were closed and the streets had a deserted appearance. The All Saints' Church excursion to Sugar Island and the Methodist Church excursion to St. Louis were both well patronized.

The Keynote Gun Club tournament on their grounds was very successful and there were so many contestants that it was dark before the programme was finished. Louis Youngblood won the challenge cup and James Funder the gold medal. The rest of the prizes were divided.

A special meeting of the Bradford City Council took place Wednesday for the purpose of opening the tenders for the sewerage works construction. G. A. Dana, of Brookville, was the lowest with \$37,977 for both sections of the work, and Nihan, Elliott & Phipps, of Bradford, second with \$46,713.

Mr. Dana only sent a check for \$1,000, instead of \$2,000, and for this reason several of the aldermen contended that the whole thing should be thrown over and new tenders called for. This was finally decided on by a vote of ten to five.

The Aylmer Sun: A visit to the Southern Counties Pork Factory found everything in line order for a large fall and winter business. The facilities for curing and curing of hogs are unsurpassed in the Dominion and reflect great credit on the skill and shrewdness of Mr. Scott. To those who have never visited the factory the prospect is truly interesting. Although the business is conducted on a much smaller scale than Armour's, of Chicago, yet the same convenience and mastery of detail are everywhere apparent. The hogs, after being weighed, are penned in lots, the same animals which have been reared by the one person being placed in one pen. This gives the animals a home feeling and they are so likely to injure each other as they would be were they mixed up indiscriminately. The plan of erection is superior to Armour's. The hog is driven on a large platform, knocked down and cradled. The method of handling them by the legs, as in Chicago, is said to injure the meat considerably. After being scalded, the carcass takes the overhead railway for the cooling shed, where post-mortem is made and the remains slide, tracked to the cooler, which is surrounded by ice. Here it remains until the animal has cooled, when the carcass goes to the dressing room. The hams and sides, bacon, go to the curing cellar, which is also supplied with ice. Every part of the waste is used for some purpose, so that the waste is comparatively nothing. Every convenience in the shape of lights, boats, tanks for hot and cold water, etc., are at hand. This sausage machine is one of the best made, as is also the contrivance for cutting meat. The most perfect ventilation prevails, and a set of fans supply the cooling room with a strong current of pure air.
