H. C. Becker, broker, Bank of Com-
merce building, received the following
private wire from Bartlett, Frazier & Co.
today:New York, June 11.—Before our open-
ing, confidence in London had been re-
stored by the receipt of cables from
prominent New York bankers, stating
that a careful investigation had failed to
disclose any trouble in the Street. For-
eigners had been buying our stocks
in London, and later on were large
buyers here. This induced shorts to cover
heavily in our market, which resulted in
advances ranging as high as 3 points.
There was some hesitation after the
opening, and some slight reaction became
evident, but there were few stocks for
sale, and further covering carried prices
up to the opening level. There seems to
be good grounds for believing that the
urgent liquidation is over, and the dan-
ger of failures has disappeared, and
that the market is in a stronger con-
dition than for a long time. The short
interest is probably still large, but the
bears have been so extremely successful
that they may be stubborn about cover-
ing, and may make further attacks upon
values. The opinion of the best houses
is that purchases should be made on any
dips. Sales to some 425,000 shares.
