

Meanwhile, the pope sleeps in what is known as the little throne room. In this chamber, Pope Leo XIII. died. Compared with the other rooms in the Vatican, it is considered small, thought it measures 20x20 feet, and the ceiling is 15 feet Adjoins the Library.

As it adjoins the large papal lib-rary, where Pius X. and Benedict received visitors, the chamber was transformed into a small throne room. A throne was placed opposite the window, and on the floor was a magnificent carpet presented by Alfonso XII. of Spain, to Pope Leo, having in its center the coat of arms

of the Spanish sovereign. The throne has been removed, being replaced by the small iron bed in which Pius sleeps. This is sheltered by a screen, part of the room is a large desk at which the pope works and where he daily receives the papal secretary of state, Cardinal Gasparri, and ther leading Vatican officials.



Phone 1742W. ywt be published by the labor department present an anomalous situation. They show that in the month of January, while employment was still on the increase, there was more time lost through strikes than in either the previous month or in January of 1921.

They show that there were in existence at some time or other during last month 23 strikes, involving about 3.357 work people, with a time loss of about 76,070 working days. During the previous month there were in existence 17 strikes, involving 2.883 work people and 64,733 working days. In January, 1921, there were 21 strikes, involving 1,736 work people, and a time loss of 30,065 working days.


