Ottawn, May 20—Emergency legislation to authorize the Dominion government to make leans to the provincial sovernments for use through the provincial loan organizations as suggested by Dr. Tory, and the provincial and commerce committee this afternoon. The loans should be guaranteed, he said, by the provinces. Dr. Tory thought that all that would be necessary would be to get parliamentary permission. The details might be left to be worked out by the Dominion government.

As a basis for this proposal. Dr. Tory summarized his main conclusion on the permanent problem. He laid down these principles:

1—The farm loan board principle, as operated in the United States was sound, and could be applied to Canada.


