SPLENDID YEAR OF WORK SHOWN

Dr. MacGregor Believes Success at St. Andrew's Greatest in History.

Outstanding success both financially and in the point of service marked this year for the various departments at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church. This announcement was made by Rev. Dr. D. C. MacGregor who presided last night at the first session of the annual meeting of the congregation. In fact Dr. MacGregor thought it was the most successful year in the history of the church. Reports were received from several departments. It was announced that a total of \$19,682, an increase of \$3,500 over last year, was contributed to missions. Of this amount \$11,142 was collected through the weekly envelope system; \$5,500 was given in response to a special appeal. \$1,637 was contributed by the Women's Missionary Society, while \$1,115 was given to equip the MacKay Memorial Hospital in Formosa where Dr. Taylor the special representative of the congregation is working. The Ladies Aid reported contributions amounting in all to \$2,152. The board of managers will bring in its report on Friday next, it was announced.

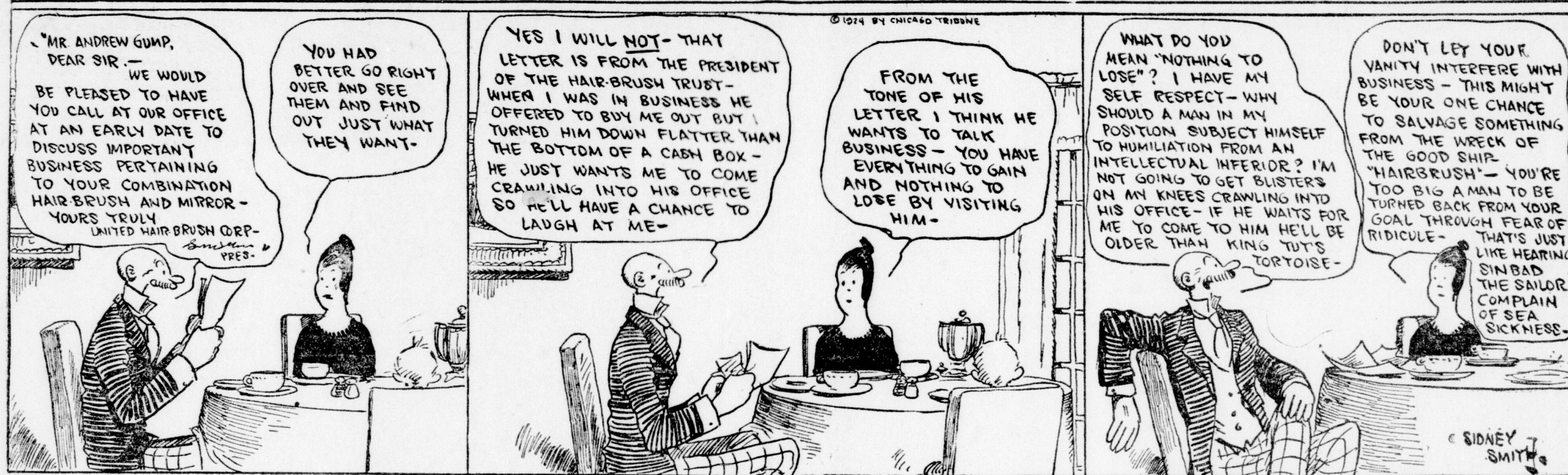
LONDON IS UNKNOWN TO INDIANAPOLIS PEOPLE

Peculiar Conception of Ontario Held by People in the U. S. City.

The majority of Indianapolis people and students of American universities have never heard of London, Ontario. A few have heard of St. Thomas, principally because it is on the main line of the Michigan Central Railway. This is the message brought back from the Indianapolis student convention by Cecil Snyder, of the University of Western Ontario. According to Mr. Snyder many people of the United States are under the impression that Ontario is a city, and that there are only two universities in Canada—Toronto Varsity and McGill. In a report of the convention in this week's issue of the Western U. I. Gazette, Mr. Snyder says he pointed out to the Americans their mistake, and assured them London was prominently on the map.

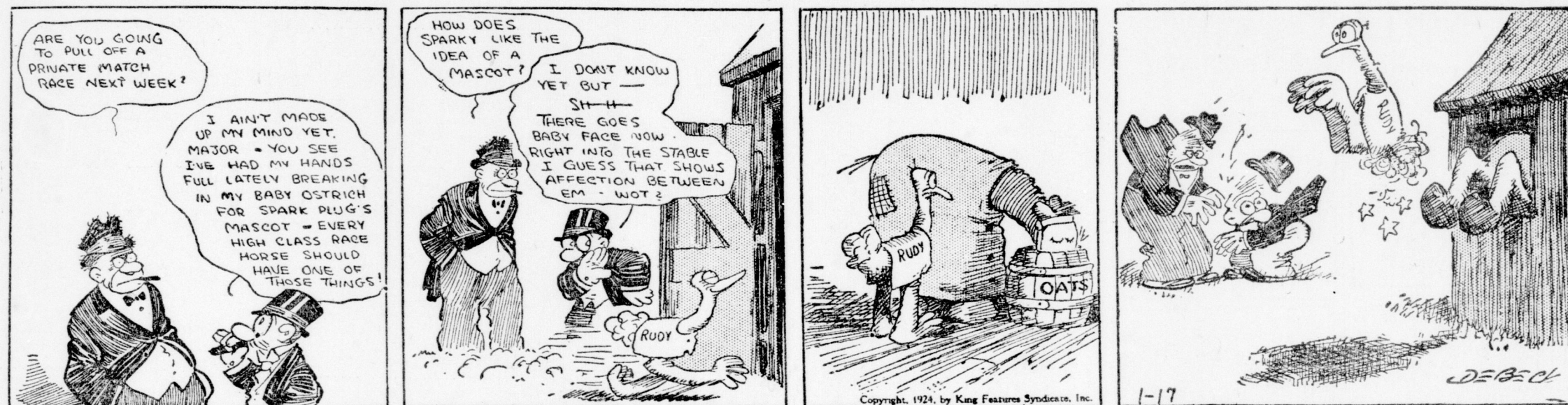

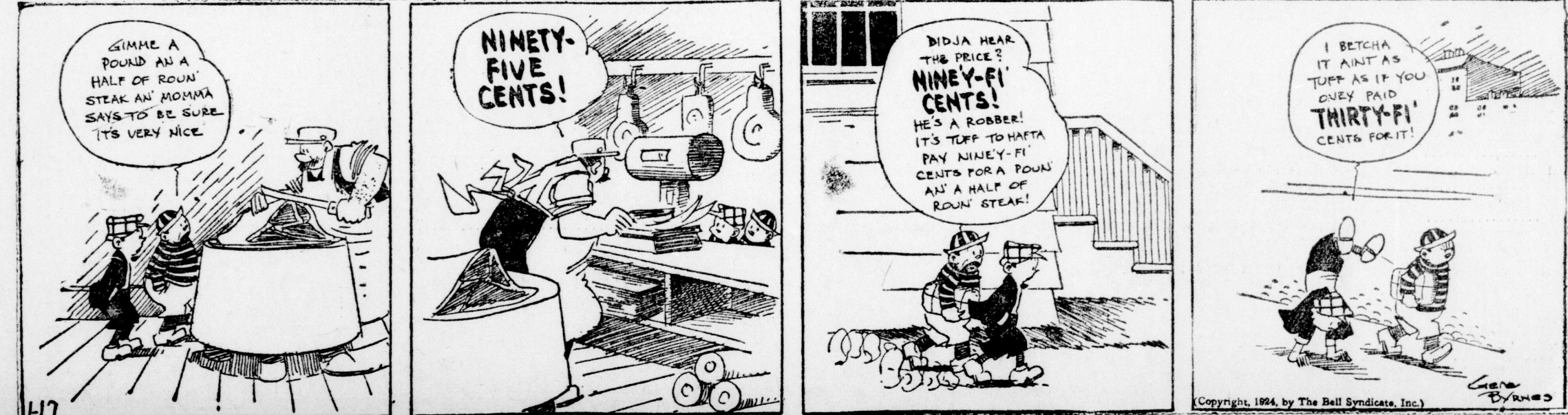
