

> At the first meeting of the Royal Institution for the advancement of learn ing of British Columbia, held in Van couver on March 19th, the following was set forth as showing the aims of the organization:

Third—Believing that it is in the interest of education that the principle of non-sectarianism, upon which the public and high school systems are based, should be applied throughout the higher branches of learning, the Royal Institution declares itself to be a non-denominational body.
