**DAMMING THE FAMED  
STRAITS OF BELLEISLE**

Latest Development in a Much  
Discussed Suggestion as to  
Changing the Climate

Halifax, N. S. Oct. 28.—Dr. Pelle-  
tier, the agent general of the Province  
of Quebec in London, and Mr. L. A.  
Cannon, of Quebec, have been in Ot-  
tawa discussing with Government of-  
ficials the recently resurrected pro-  
ject of damming the Straits of Belle  
Isle. It is announced that, as a re-  
sult of representations made, a con-  
crete proposition will shortly be pre-  
sented before the Government. Dr. Pel-  
letier and Mr. Cannon assert that  
they are making the move at the in-  
stance of English capitalists who are  
prepared to go on with the project  
as soon as the consent of the Govern-  
ment immediately concerned is se-  
cured. They are asking for no Gov-  
ernment assistance. They claim that  
the water which flows out of the  
Gulf of St. Lawrence now is of about  
the same or lighter gravity than the  
Arctic Current so that the Arctic Cur-  
rent courses along the Labrador and  
Newfoundland shores, whereas the water  
of the Gulf Stream being so much more  
saline and heavier would press the  
Arctic water away from these shores.  
Just why the Gulf Stream should  
work its way inside, instead of out-  
side, the Arctic Current is not ex-  
plained, but the promoters claim it  
will and that in doing so it will re-  
volutionize the climate of North Am-  
erica, so modifying it that bananas  
may be grown in Nova Scotia and  
Prince Edward Island, oranges in  
Newfoundland, and—the Arctic and  
Gulf of St. Lawrence remain ice-  
free the year round. It is further stated  
that the proposed dam can be con-  
structed for ten million dollars.
