The "Real Estate" of Many Depositors Has Been Frozen. The Bank of Commerce has suspended the operations of the Alias Craig Private Bank, which was established in 1937, and which was the only one in the city to have been so suspended.

Dr. Allen Given Until Saturday to Reply to the Charges Preferred by the Sub-Committee.

The sub-committee of the Board of Health has apparently not finished its investigation yet, as for several hours yesterday Dr. Allen was put through a course of cross-questioning by the Mayor in his office.
