Miss Carly, 221 Jarvis street, is the secretary of this deserving institution, from whom further information may be obtained.

A few Presbyterians at Nell's Harbour, Cape Breton, are making strenuous efforts to build a place of worship for themselves and the crowds of fishermen who live there during the summer. They are at present doing all they can to have a successful bazaar in September. The Harbour is half way between Ingonish and Cape North. It is an isolated place. Rev. Mr. Clark preaches there occasionally. By a faithful effort Presbyterianism may be strengthened and an amount of good done. 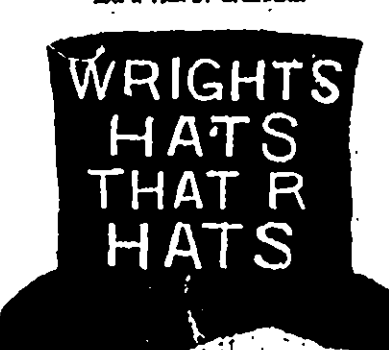
