The work that has so far been done on the Delaney Fraction, situate between the Iron Mask and Pothook properties, has shown up a ledge 20 feet in width, which can be traced for a considerable distance on the surface. The gangue appears to be a gabbro, containing silica and heavy spar. The ledge is well mineralized, containing copper pyrites and Peacock copper and assays from \$6.50 to \$8.50 in gold and copper. The shaft is down 30 feet.
