

PORT WILLIAM TO FORT GARRY.

Emigrants, \$25 : Children onder 12. half price. 150 lbs. personal bagange free. Extra luggage, \$1.50 per 100 lbs. (No horses, exen. waggons, or heavy farming implements can be taken.)

THE MODE OF CONVEYANCE.

96 miles by Railroad from Toronto to Collingwood 532 miles by Steamer from Collingwood to Fort William.

45 miles by Waggon from Fort William to Sheban-dowan Lake.

310 miles broken navigation in open boats from She-bandowan Lake to North-West Angle of the Lake of the Woods.

95 miles by Cart or Waggon from North-West Angle of the Lake of the Woods to Fort Garry.

Between Fort William and Fort Garry, huts and tents will be provided for the accommodation of Emigrants on the Portages. Passengers should take their own supplies.
