

GAVAZZI IN TRALEE - SERIOUS RIOTS - Tralee, 19th September. A riot took place in this town last night on the occasion of a lecture being delivered by Gavazzi on "Garibaldi and the present political state of Italy."

Everything is now "sensation." The good Protestants of Tralee thought Gavazzi would produce a sensation here, and they were right. Gavazzi proved a grand sensation, and the blessed fruits of his stump oratory are bitterness and hatred.

TRALEE, SUNDAY. - At the half-past eight o'clock Mass this morning in the Catholic cathedral of this town, the Very Rev. John Mawle, P.P., V.G., took occasion to refer to the outrage which took place in this town on Thursday evening, in consequence of the "oration" of Gavazzi.

Not content with the destruction of property and the danger to life and limb, which the ultra-Protestant party caused in Belfast, they must needs create a hubbub in Tralee also.

Ladies' Club. - Any member having a child, within such time after her marriage as would prevent her to have been guilty of immoral conduct before her marriage, and all unmarried members being found in the family way, are to be expelled from the society by the next monthly board of directors on discovering such offence.
