For about two years prior to using the H-M-C anesthetic I had been using hyoscine and morphine as a hypnotic and analgesic, with such excellent results that I felt that I was not properly equipped without hyoscine

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and morphine tablets in my hypodermatic case, but had never thought of its ever becoming an anesthetic.
