SOMMAIRE
 PREAMBLE

The States Parties to the present Protocol
 Considering that the progress of modern pharmacology and chemistry
 has resulted in the discovery of drugs particularly synthetic drugs capable
 of producing addiction, but not covered by the Convention of 13 July 1923
 limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs
 as amended by the Protocol signed at Lake Success on 11 December 1954
 It desiring to supplement the provisions of that Convention and to
 bring under international control those drugs containing these
 substances in order to limit by international agreement their manufacture
 and distribution and to prevent their use for purposes other than
 those for which they are intended

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CHAPTER I CONTROL

1. Any State Party to the present Protocol which considers that a drug
 which is or may be used for medical or scientific purposes and to which
 the Convention of 13 July 1923 does not apply is liable to the same kind of
 control and production of the same kind of harmful effects as the drugs specified
 in article 1 paragraph 2 of the said Convention shall send a notification to
 the United Nations who shall transmit it immediately to the other States
 Parties to the present Protocol to the Commission on Narcotic Drugs of the
 Economic and Social Council and to the World Health Organization
 2. If the World Health Organization finds that the drug in question
 is or may be used for medical or scientific purposes and to which the
 Convention of 13 July 1923 does not apply it shall recommend to the
 States Parties to the present Protocol to the Commission on Narcotic Drugs
 of the Economic and Social Council and to the World Health Organization
 that they should apply to the drug in question the same kind of control
 and production as the drugs specified in article 1 paragraph 2 of the
 Convention of 13 July 1923
