Canada-Brunei Relations

- Brunei is a small, oil-rich Islamic sultanate on the north coast of Borneo. It has a high per capita gross domestic product for a country its size.
- Brunei was co-ordinator of the dialogue between Canada and the Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN) from 1989 to 1991.
 It was host of the 1995 ASEAN Regional Forum and Post-Ministerial Conference.
- A member of the Commonwealth, Brunei is a major contributor to the Commonwealth of Learning, based in Vancouver.

Trade and Investment

- Bilateral trade between Canada and Brunei for 1994 totalled \$2.78 million. Canadian exports to Brunei were valued at \$2.6 million, up from \$1.5 million in 1993.
- Principal Canadian exports include tobacco; manufactured goods such as boilers and machinery; electrical machinery and equipment; aluminium; and optical, photographic and other precision equipment.
- In 1994, Canada imported \$182,000 worth of goods from Brunei, predominantly apparel and clothing accessories. Imports in 1993 soared to \$8.5 million with a one-time import of mineral fuels, oils and related products.
- Power generation and defence and aerospace products are the main areas of opportunity for Canadian business in Brunei.
