I believe we are facing a social upheaval much like that which occurred during the Napoleonic wars. I remember once seeing the show Anthony Adverse, which started off with a scroll which read something like this: People born in times of social upheaval are unlucky. They can contemplate neither the past nor the future with equanimity. They are a race of lost souls.

If we can build real morale and develop a real society in this country that will stand out as an example, then we can progress and continue with the development of this country. But if we allow it to deteriorate, according to the examples I have cited

tonight, then we are going to have to face inevitable trouble in the days ahead. In the past, nations have fallen because of dry rot from within. Let us see if we cannot develop a modern state that will give us a high standard of living and a high order of democracy.
