## FISHERIES

BRITISH COLUMBIA—ISSUE OF NEW SALMON FISHING LICENCES

On the orders of the day:

Mr. Lloyd R. Crouse (South Shore): Mr. Speaker, I wish to direct a question to the Minister of Fisheries relating to the new regulations he has announced to control the size of the British Columbia salmon fishing fleet. The program as announced sets a top limit on the number of fishing vessels that may engage in the industry, and since objections have been raised about these new regulations, what steps does the minister propose taking to ensure that there will be no discrimination in the issuing of new licences?

Hon. Jack Davis (Minister of Fisheries): Mr. Speaker, the licences are those of existing boats. The boats can be traded, they can be bought or sold by anyone. There is no limitation as to the number of fishermen; we have simply set a maximum on the number of fishing vessels on the west coast engaged in catching salmon.

Mr. Crouse: Mr. Speaker, if a licensed salmon fishing boat is burned or lost at sea, will a licence be granted to the new, replacement ship?

Mr. Davis: Mr. Speaker, there will be no automatic granting of a licence. That particular vessel will be struck from the registry. An appeal committee has been set up to which the unfortunate owner can apply, and depending on the circumstances he may or may not obtain a new licence.

Mr. Frank Howard (Skeena): Mr. Speaker, I have a supplementary question for the Minister of Fisheries. A few days ago I asked the minister whether he would be prepared to take the initiative in referring these 29180-651

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as the membership of that committee was announced the other day, can the minister say when he will have on the order paper a motion to refer this matter to the committee for study?

Mr. Davis: Soon, I hope, Mr. Speaker. This is a new system; it is a world first. There are probably a few wrinkles which need to be ironed out, hence I will be only too happy to see it referred to the committee and hear positive suggestions on how to improve the system.

Mr. Howard (Skeena): Could the minister say when this might be?

Mr. Davis: As soon as possible, Mr. Speaker.

CAPE BRETON-REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF DEVCO REPORT
