(b) on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars or to imprisonment for one year, or to both."

Hon. Marcel Lambert (Edmonton West): Mr. Speaker, as with the four preceding motions, I move, seconded by the hon. member for Malpèque (Mr. MacLean), the following subamendment: That, in the English text, all the words following the word, "following" be stricken out and the following be substituted therefor:

[English]

That motion No. 15 be amended by striking out all the words following the word "following" and by substituting therefor the following:

"a fine in the discretion of the court or to imprisonment for five years, or to both; or

(b) on summary conviction, to a fine of twenty-five thousand dollars or to imprisonment for one year, or to both."

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Shall the amendment carry?

Some hon. Members: Agreed.

Some hon. Members: No.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: All those in favour of the amendment will please say yea.

Some hon. Members: Yea.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: All those opposed will please say nay.

Some hon. Members: Nay.

Hon. Marcel Lambert (Edmonton West): Mr. Speaker, I move the same amendment:

That motion No. 19 be amended by striking out all the words following the word "following" and by substituting therefor the following:

"a fine in the discretion of the court or to imprisonment for five years, or to both; or

(b) on summary conviction, to a fine of twenty-five thousand dollars or to imprisonment for one year, or to both."
