MEASURE RESPECTING APPOINTMENT AND TENURE OF SENIOR OFFICERS

Mr. Stan Schellenberger (Wetaskiwin) moved for leave to introduce Bill C-230, an Act respecting the appointment of deputy, associate deputy and assistant deputy ministers.

He said: Mr. Speaker, the purpose of this Bill is to standardize the method of appointment and tenure of the senior officers of the Public Service and to tie their appointments to the duration of a Parliament. The Public Service would thereby be more accountable to the government of the day and to the electorate.

Motion agreed to, Bill read the first time and ordered to be printed.
