In the preparation of the sketch plans presented today we have had the benefit of both Mr. Stevens' and Mr. Lee's views, more particularly in connection with what may be called the working parts of the building, by means of interchange both of ideas and of sketches. We understand that they will furnish us with details of other buildings, erected for similar purposes, which they recommend as models in various particulars, and also any information they may have for which we may apply. It is in connection with the internal arrangement of laboratories that Mesers. Stevens and Lee can be of greatest service, and we propose furnishing to them, and to the professors concerned, skeleton plans on which to lay out the furnishings, fittings and fixtures, so that proper structural provision can be made for those things by us.
