- (7) What proportion of students take such courses?
- (8) Are all arms represented in the O.T.C.?
- (9) What is their comparative popularity? The Inf.
- (10) Of the Commissioned Ranks, what proportion of them, if any, are confined to members of the University Staff?
- (11) Generally, what are the aims and ambitions of the corps?
