"When ice is reported on or near the frack a ship must proceed during the night at moderate speed or alter its course, so as to clear the danger zone.

"The effective lighting of boat decks is provided for, and the carrying of Morse lamps is made compulsory. An international code for urgent and important signais has been adopted."

Danger Still Exists.

Lord Mersey said that, even after the most careful attention, there still remained the possibility of a serious and even totally destructive accident. It was, therefore, imperative that captains should never relax their vigilance on the supposition that any vessel was unsinkable.
