I would propose, that all Manner of Necessaries for the support of the Fishermen, should be made as cheap as possible, provided you don't hurt the Mother Country. Every Thing for the carrying on this immense Branch of Trade, is the Product of England, except Beef, Pork, and Butter, from Ireland; Rum, Sugar, and Melasses, from the West-Indies and New-England; as also a good deal of Bread and Flour, from New-York, Philadelphia, Boston. &c.

We have from Portugal and Spain. Salt and Olive Oil, and a mere Trifle of Port and Liston Wines; Oil is what the Fishermen cannot do without, to eat with falt Fish, both Winter and Summer; and as the Oil must first be brought to England, and then re-shipped for Newfoundland, notwithstanding it leaves but the meerest Trisle at the Custom House, yet the double Freight, and many other Expences, make it come exceeding dear to the Fishermen; therefore was it allowed to be taken on Board the Ships that are constantly returning from Liston, and other Ports, with Salt to Newfoundland, the Fishermen would be able to purchase
