Nations, and his Glory above the Heavens, he maketh the barren Woman to keep Houfe, and to be a joyful Mother of Children." Can't we now by thefe Things fee that our prefent Deliverance is great Occafion of Joy and Thankfgiving? Don't we learn the Propriety of the joyful Affemblies of this Day? What Nation is there fo great, who hath God fo nigh unto them, as the Lord our God is in all Things that we call upon him for? "We have fown in Fears, but now reap in Joy. We have gone forth weeping, but we are now returning, bringing our Sheaves with us."

It only remains now that we confider

Fiftbly, To whom our Sacrifices of Thankfgiving fhould be offered, and through whom alone they can be accepted.

And now we eafily learn from our Text that God muft be the fupreme Object of our Praife; for it is granted that he who grants Salvation, fhould have the Praife of it: Aud faith our Text, " Had not the Lord been on our Side," & and again; " Our Help is in the Name of the Lord, who made Heaven and Earth." Thofe Men who have been the Inftruments in the Hand of Providence, to bring about thefe great and interefti Events, have juftly raifed their Characters, and immortalifed their Names; but we may not be fo lavish in our Praifes of
