Ominous Silence Followed Awful Salisbury Calamity

Graphic Description of the Steamship Express Which Crushed Out Lives of Twenty-Three Passengers-High Speed Undoubtedly Cause of Disaster.

Salisbury, Eng., July 2.—The scene of yesterday's / disaster to the American Line special from Plymouth, having on board the passengers who were landed there from the steamer New York presents little evidence to-day of the havoc wrought by the wreck of the express train, all the wreckage having been cleared away. The engineering staff of the railroad company are still seeking an explanation for the immediate cause of the derailment, but thus far have been unable to do so, or are not ready to say to what the catastrophe is attributed.

The inquest was opened this after—
