The receipts of flour and wheat at the primary markots during last week were 227, 012 barrels flour, and 4,482,176 bushels of wheat, as compared with 153,753 barrels flour and 2,470,114 bushels wheat in corres-

dour and 2.470,114 bushels wheat in corresponding week of last year.

Farmers in Michigan are estimated to have sold 9,769,000 bushels wheat during the dive months ended Dec. 31, as compared with 9,034,000 bushels for the same time in 1897. The Washington estimate of the 1898 wheat crop of Michigan was 28,920,000 bushels. From this it would appear that a large part of the crop is still in farmers' hands.

Argentina.—Broomball's cables state that the harvest is late, and movement of wheat so far is light. The Buenos Ayres correspondent of The Northwestern Miller gives the estimate of a Rosario paper, which places the crop at 75,000,000 bushels, apparenty available for export. The Miller's correspondent thinks that 15 per cent. should be deducted from the Rosario estimate, which he thinks is excessive to that extent in average yield per acre. This would reduce the surplus to 37,250,000 bushels.

The trunk railway lines are reported as adhering very firmly to the tariff rates on breadstuffs and provisions from the west to the seaboard, which are now quoted at 18 cents per 100 lbs. for the former and 30 cents for the latter from Chicago to New York. At these rates there is not the same inducement as formerly for prompt shipment, all rail, to the seaboard. As a consequence of this, the premium on cash wheat over May has disappeared, and at all western markets May wheat is quoted higher than cash. The present through rail freight is equal to 11c per bushel; the probability is that the lake and canal rate next May will not exceed 5c per bushel. This difference in freight gives encouragement to dealers to hold their wheat.
