We can live and grow fat on our own products. You have also shown the large quantity of wheat that the comparatively few farmers, some 32,000 at present in our Northwest, have produced the last season for export—some 45,000,000 bushels. This was accomplished under a wasteful and ineconomical system of production. Under the circumstances it is an excellent showing, which no other wheat producing country can equal.

The capital required to purchase the necessary machinery and earry yout the enterprise would be about \$10,000 for machinery and \$1200 for contingencies. 
