The County Almshouse at Chatham Burned-Four Aged Inmates Perish-Scicide at Norwich.

[G. N. W. Special to The Advertiser.] Chatham, N.S., April 15.-The County Alms House here was destroyed by fire early this morning. Four aged in-

mates were burned to death. DETAILS OF THE TRAGEDY. The flames broke out at midnight. There were 30 paupers sleeping in the building, besides the keeper and matron, Mr. and Mrs. Templeton, with their servants. The fire came so suddenly and spread so rapidly, that when the fire brigade reached the scene it could do nothing to save the poorhouse,

which, with a new barn and outbuildings, was entirely destroyed. THE LOST. Three bodies of men have been found and a fourth is missing, whose remains it is expected will be uncovered in the ruins. The four men lost were: Owen McLean, Henry Hobb, John McIntyre and Thomas Black. All were advanced in years. Nearly all the other inmates had narrow escapes from death, and
