GRAIN AND PRODUCE.
Foreign news was generally against holders on Wednesday and the Chicago wheat pit sold off early to \$1.12 1/2 for May option. Liverpool cables were lower than previous day, but cash wheat continued in fair demand and market rallied to 1 1/2, towards the close.
January wheat at Winnipeg sold off to 1 1/2 at the close, but the other futures remained unchanged from preceding session. Local dealers held Manitoba wheat at \$1.14 and \$1.12 for Nos. 1 and 2 wheat. Oats closed 1/2 to 1/4 higher at Winnipeg and local quotations were up 1/2 all round, the range being 42c and 44c, following the outside market.

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BREAK IN COTTON

Renewal of Bull Panic Under Heavy Liquidating Sales.

NEW YORK, Jan. 12.—Cotton futures and the market for the cotton in the cotton market this morning accompanied by even greater demoralization than on the previous break.

Liquidation began in Liverpool and was continued on a tremendous scale in the local market to 45 to 48 points under the closing prices of last night. Beyond the weakness of Liverpool, there was nothing in the news to account for the fresh outburst of liquidation here, but it is believed that recent sensational fluctuations have unsettled holders of very large lines of contracts and one of the big Southern operators was credited with having liquidated fully 100,000 bales during the first hour's trading.

The New Orleans bulls soon abandoned all efforts to support prices and the bull panic developed its most sensational phases during the middle of the day.

Prices which had rallied about \$1 per bale from the early low point, broke to new low records for the movement under a rush of cotton from all directions, with March selling at \$14.00 and May and July at 14.75, about \$3.50 to \$3.80 per bale below the closing figures of last night.

New Orleans showed even greater weakness, May cotton there declining 76 points.

Tremendous as the losses suffered by bull speculators during the past two weeks have been, there was absolutely no suggestion of financial difficulties among local commission houses and the fact that brokers had been calling on their customers for margins of \$10 or more per bale is said to have placed the trade in a very sound position financially.

May rallied 25 points from the lowest during the afternoon on covering by the bear clique, but the advance was not fully maintained, owing to a renewal of liquidation in the late trading.

The market closed fairly steady at a loss of 17 to 34 points for the day, with March noted at 14.55 and May at 14.95.

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
