AMERICAN PROSPERITY. Stocks Hold Their Activity and High Prices—Enlarged Purchasing Power.

The foreign trade statement for February presents a remarkable showing of the results of American prosperity—enlarged purchasing power for commodities is reflected in a volume of imports the largest for any month on record and crossing the hundred million-dollar mark for the twenty-eight days of last month.
